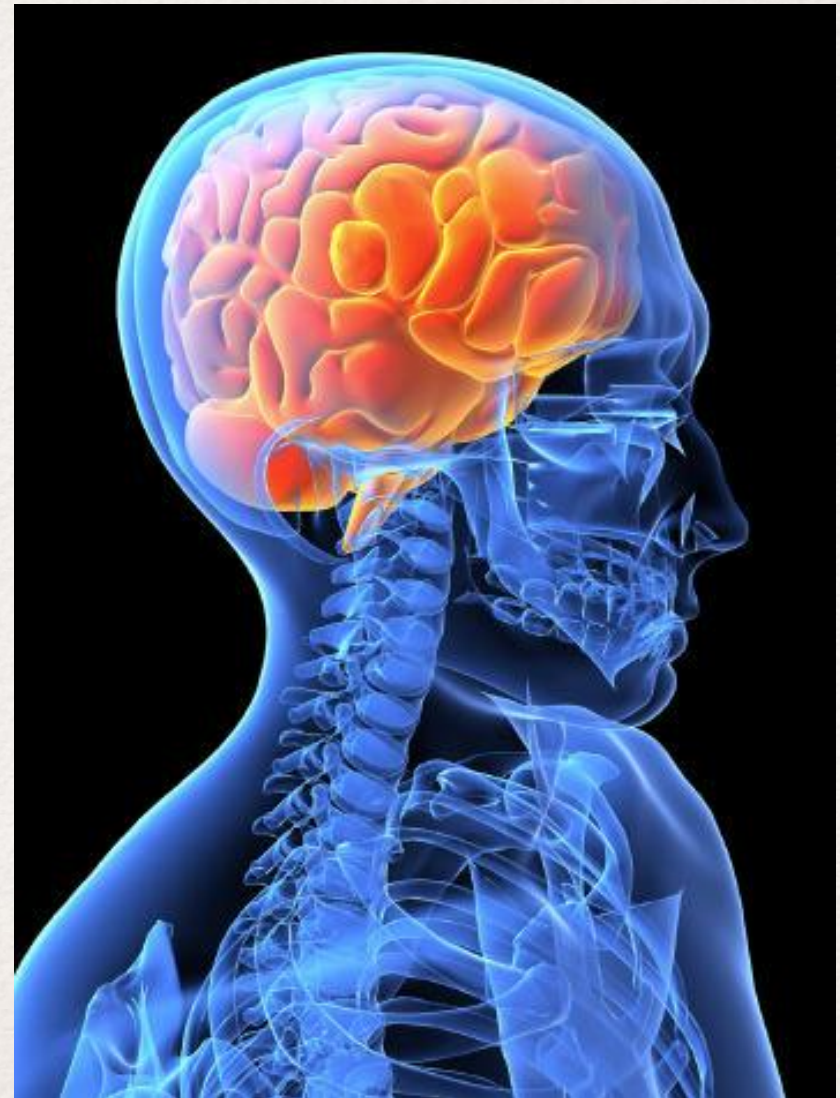
Why can't you stop using drugs and alcohol?

- However, the reality is that alcohol and drug addiction is a complex and chronic relapsing medical disease.



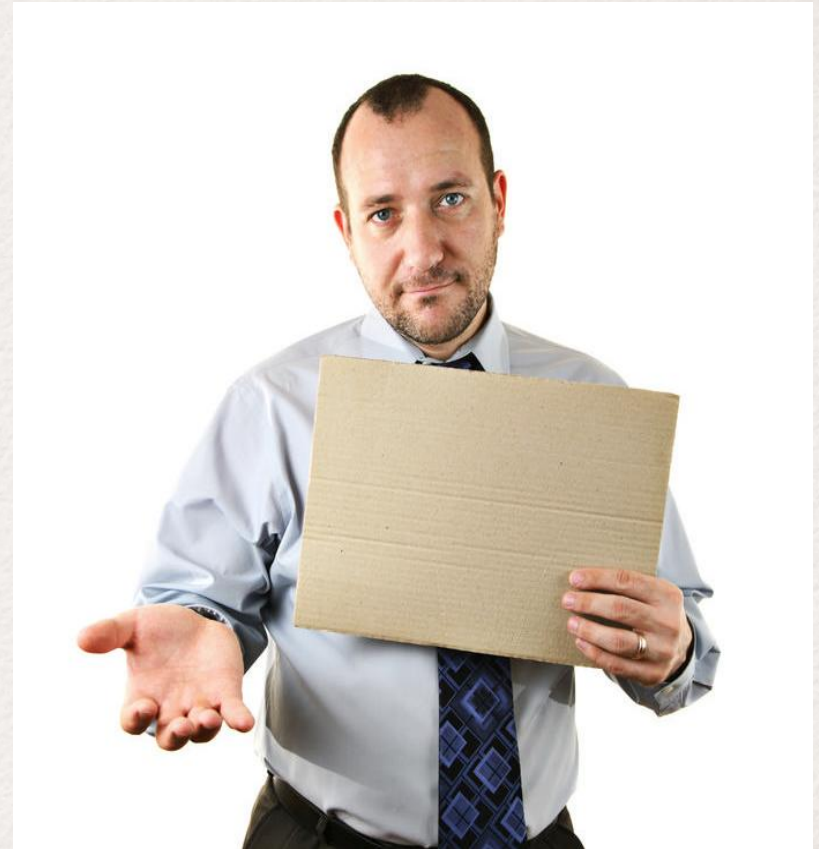
Addiction is a Disease of the Brain's Reward System
